### **Jewish Foundation for Education of Women Celebrates 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary**

The Jewish Foundation for Education of Women is celebrating its 125th anniversary this year by awarding 125th Anniversary Fellowships to outstanding students from each of its seven programs.

Originally founded in the 19th century to help immigrant Jewish women adjust to American life, the Foundation is, today, a private, nonsectarian organization whose mission is to help women of all backgrounds and ages attain the education and training they need to make them productive, economically independent members of the community. To that end, the Foundation has been providing scholarship assistance for higher education to women with financial need for more than 65 years.

The nine Fellows who were selected will be saluted at a party on Thursday, November 3rd, at the Harmonie Club in Manhattan. Also to be celebrated are the many institutional partners with whom the Foundation now collaborates, among them Teachers College of Columbia University, the Jewish Theological Seminary and CUNY.

Among those offering salutations to the honorees and the Foundation will be Mary Schmidt Campbell, dean of the Tisch School of the Arts at New York University and Muza Guzband, LCSW, a JFEW alumna who is currently supervisor of the Russian Adolescent Project of the Jewish Board of Family and Children's Services, which nominates students to the Foundation for scholarships.
